ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The candidate applying for BBS, BA and BE.d program must:

- Secure at least passed division in the +2, PCL or equivalent program from any university board or institution recognized by TU.
- Comply with all the application procedures.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

(i) Written Test

Applicants are required to appear in the examination conducted by the campus. Students must secure a minimum of 40% in the examination in order to qualify for the enrollment. The examination follows the standard testing patterns and includes areas like verbal ability, quantitative ability, logical reasoning, and general awareness.

(ii) Interview

Candidates will be interviewed and selected for admission. Short listing is based on written test.

(iii) Ratings:

LEARNING/TEACHING PEDAGOGY

We adopt class lectures, group discussions, field visits, practical exercises, laboratory works, and project works as our teaching pedagogy. The teaching faculty will determine the choice of the teaching methodology according to the needs of the course.

We use internet, multi-media projector as teaching aid to facilitate the learning process and we invite guest lecturers/speakers from management and entrepreneurship field.

EVALUATION AND EXAMINATION SYSTEM

The BBS, BA, BE.d programs require the duration of 4 years to complete the course. The final exams are conducted by TU Examination Board on annual basis. The campus also conduct regular examinations for internal evaluation. Only those students who fill up the exam form will be eligible for studying next year.

ATTENDANCE

Students are required to attend all lectures, practical classes, seminars, and presentations regularly. A candidate must have minimum 80% attendance to be eligible for the final examination.

TRANSFERS

A student can transfer in TU recognized universities with the permission of the concerned Dean office.


- All the students must enter the college in proper campus uniform.

• Students have to pay for any damages caused to college and campus properties and it may lead to their expulsion.


• Students are rigidly discouraged to visit public places like cinema hall, pool houses, restaurants and discos in campus uniform.
